WHAT HAPPENED (SINCE PREVIOUS 24 HOURS)



PROTEST ACTIVITY CONTINUES ACROSS MULTIPLE PROVINCES

- Multiple protest actions and marches recorded in Western Cape, KwaZulu-Natal, Gauteng and Mpumalanga.
- Mix of anti-immigration mobilisation, service delivery grievances and community actions.



MARCH AND MARCH MOBILISATION REMAINS ACTIVE

- Anti-immigration marches in Cape Town (Wynberg – Newlands) and Stellenbosch CBD on 20 June.
- Planned marches in Volksrust (22 June) and Parklands (27 June).



ROAD DISRUPTIONS & LOCAL PROTESTS PERSIST

- N2 Kokstad: Road blocked with burning debris and trees (20 June).
- Kamaqhekeza, MP: Road barricaded (20 June).
- Lenasia, GP: Road closure due to electricity-related protest (20 June).



NO EVIDENCE OF COORDINATED NATIONWIDE ACTION

- Protests remain localised and issue-driven.
- No confirmed large-scale, coordinated national shutdown activity.



BUSINESS & COMMUNITY IMPACTS ONGOING

- Localised traffic delays and road closures impacting logistics and operations.
- Reports of intimidation and calls for shutdowns of foreign-owned businesses continue.



SECURITY ENVIRONMENT REMAINS STABLE OVERALL

- Law enforcement maintains visible presence in key hotspots.
- No major escalation in violence or large-scale unrest recorded.

22 JUNE 2026
VOLKSRUST, MP

- Planned March & March mobilisation
- Start: Vukuzakhe Stadium (Mavuso St)
- Destination: Dr Pixley ka Seme Local Municipality
- Focus: Against illegal foreign nationals



23 – 26 JUNE 2026
HEIGHTENED MONITORING PERIOD

- Anti-immigration mobilisation expected to continue
- Increased risk of copycat actions and road blockages



27 JUNE 2026
PARKLANDS, CAPE TOWN, WC

- Planned March & March mobilisation
- Assembly: Echium Park, Parklands
- Focus: Against illegal immigrants



30 JUNE 2026
NATIONWIDE MOBILISATION DEADLINE (HIGH RISK)

- March and March & allied groups continue to call for national action
- Potential for increased protests, road disruptions & business impact
- Law enforcement expected to maintain elevated readiness

Continue active monitoring and proactive risk management.

KEY RECOMMENDATIONS



ENHANCE SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

Maintain close monitoring of protest planning, March and March activity and local sentiment.



PROTECT PEOPLE

Review employee movement, safety protocols and communication plans in high-risk areas.



MANAGE LOGISTICS RISK

Monitor key routes and plan alternative logistics routes to mitigate disruption.



SECURE ASSETS & OPERATIONS

Strengthen security around sites and retail operations, especially foreign-owned businesses.



COMMUNICATE & ENGAGE

Maintain clear communication with employees, suppliers and stakeholders.
