EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Anti-illegal immigration mobilisation remains active across multiple provinces ahead of the 30 June mobilisation deadline. Overnight activity remained largely localised and was characterised by isolated road blockages, protest actions, planned marches and continued humanitarian pressures involving displaced foreign nationals. Mobilisation remains decentralised with multiple independent organisations and community groups pursuing broadly aligned objectives.



1. WHAT HAS HAPPENED (PAST 12 HOURS)



Protest activity continued across Gauteng, KwaZulu-Natal and the Western Cape with isolated incidents of road blockades, tyre burning and intimidation reported overnight.



Malawian nationals demonstrated outside the Malawi Consulate in Woodmead requesting organised repatriation assistance, highlighting continuing humanitarian pressures.



Looting and public disorder reported in Elsies River, Western Cape. Based on current reporting, the incident is not directly linked to the anti-illegal immigration mobilisation and is assessed separately.



Additional planned anti-illegal immigration marches confirmed for Newcastle and Verulam in KwaZulu-Natal during Saturday.



No significant deterioration in the national security posture has been identified overnight.

3. INTELLIGENCE ASSESSMENT



Current reporting indicates that anti-illegal immigration mobilisation continues to expand geographically through multiple independent community actions and organised marches.



Available intelligence continues to support the assessment that protest activity is decentralised rather than directed through a single national command structure.



The principal operational risks remain localised road disruptions, community mobilisation, intimidation of businesses and transport delays within identified hotspot areas.



Gauteng and KwaZulu-Natal continue to present the highest operational exposure ahead of 30 June.



4. EXECUTIVE CLIENT ACTIONS



Monitor planned protest locations before deploying personnel.



Review alternative transport routes within identified hotspot areas.



Increase management visibility and supervisory oversight at higher-risk facilities.



Confirm escalation procedures and communication protocols with site management teams.



Maintain heightened situational awareness throughout the weekend and continue monitoring verified intelligence updates.



EXECUTIVE OUTLOOK

The operational outlook for the weekend remains consistent with previous assessments. While the number of planned demonstrations continues to increase ahead of 30 June, available intelligence indicates that disruption is likely to remain localised around identified hotspot areas rather than manifest as a coordinated nationwide shutdown. Organisations operating within Gauteng and KwaZulu-Natal should maintain heightened operational readiness and continue implementing established business continuity measures where appropriate.
