EXECUTIVE ASSESSMENT



Intelligence indicates a **slight improvement** in the national operating environment during the past 24 hours. No evidence of a material deterioration in the national security posture.



The overall national risk remains **AMBER (MODERATE)**. Mobilisation activity continues across multiple provinces, however disruption is assessed to remain localised rather than a coordinated national shutdown.



Government response has **strengthened** through enhanced SAPS deployments, integrated joint operational centres and improved coordination with metro police and traffic authorities. **Diplomatic engagement** and **humanitarian actions** have also improved the situation.



The principal operational concern remains localised **vigilante activity** and isolated **retaliatory incidents** outside formally organised demonstrations. Organisations should maintain focus on identified hotspot areas, strategic transport routes and commercial trading precincts.

- 1 Overall national threat remains stable.
- 2 Government operational coordination has improved.
- 3 Diplomatic engagement and humanitarian interventions have strengthened.
- 4 Xenophobic sentiment remains stable with no significant increase or decrease.
- 5 Vigilante activity and isolated retaliatory incidents remain the primary operational concern.
- 6 Enhanced monitoring continues across identified high-risk locations.

CURRENT SITUATION

National Risk remains AMBER (Moderate). No intelligence of a deterioration overnight.



WHAT HAS CHANGED

Government coordination and law enforcement readiness have improved. Diplomatic situation and humanitarian response have strengthened.



THREAT ENVIRONMENT

Mobilisation remains active with multiple demonstrations confirmed and assessed. Localised disruption is the most likely scenario.



LAW ENFORCEMENT POSTURE

Integrated SAPS, Metro Police, POP, Traffic Authorities and Joint Operational Structures remain fully deployed with rapid reaction capability.



BUSINESS IMPACT

Operational impacts are expected to remain localised around known hotspot areas, march routes, transport corridors and commercial centres.



INTELLIGENCE JUDGEMENT

Current intelligence supports continued enhanced monitoring rather than escalation of the national threat level.

EXECUTIVE OUTLOOK

Intelligence indicates that the operating environment has stabilised despite continued mobilisation activity. While the overall national threat assessment remains **AMBER (Moderate)**, organisations should maintain heightened awareness around verified hotspot areas, known march routes, freight corridors and commercial centres where localised disruption, vigilante activity and opportunistic criminality remain credible operational risks.

EXECUTIVE ASSESSMENT

Route-level intelligence is concentrated in Gauteng, where Johannesburg CBD/Hillbrow (Routes 1 & 2) and Midrand (Route 3) have fully published routes. An additional inner-city movement (Route 4) is expected to add pressure across the CBD retail and business nodes. Pretoria has confirmed affected streets around Church Square but no consistently published turn-by-turn route. Durban (Route 5) remains a corridor-based assessment due to uncertainty over the final approved destination.

All remaining provinces should be managed as hotspot areas rather than route-confirmed march corridors.

- Focus should be on CBDs, transport nodes, taxi ranks, government precincts and major commercial centres.
- Routes may be released at short notice. Maintain agile operational readiness.

EXECUTIVE ASSESSMENT

Outside of the fully published routes in Johannesburg (Routes 1 & 2) and Midrand (Route 3), and the corridor-based assessment for Durban, all other provinces have confirmed gatherings or focal areas but no street-level routes published as of 28 June 2026. These areas should be managed as hotspot environments with heightened situational awareness, visible law enforcement presence and operational readiness for rapid response.
Route information remains fluid – continuous monitoring and intelligence updates are essential.

OPERATIONAL ASSESSMENT

Transport and logistics networks remain a key vulnerability during planned national demonstrations. Road blockades, protests and secondary incidents pose a significant risk to freight movement, fuel supply, public transport and access to strategic economic nodes. Organisations must ensure route risk assessments, contingency routing, driver briefings and real-time monitoring are in place throughout 30 June 2026.

- Monitor local conditions closely and ensure communication channels with your teams remain open and effective.



REVIEW & UPDATE PLANS

- Ensure contingency and business continuity plans are current, tested and aligned to the latest threat environment.
- Verify escalation procedures and contact lists.



STRENGTHEN SECURITY POSTURE

- Review physical security measures, access control, CCTV monitoring and patrol visibility at your sites.
- Ensure critical assets and infrastructure are protected.



ENGAGE & REPORT

- Encourage team awareness and reporting of suspicious activities.
- Report incidents, risks or emerging concerns to BPC for timely intelligence and operational support.



STAY INFORMED

- Regularly monitor updates on the BPC Unrest WhatsApp Group and via the TiS Live Dashboard for real-time intelligence and risk alerts.



PRACTICAL SECURITY PRECAUTIONS

- Secure movable assets – lock away tools, equipment, stock, IT devices and valuable items when not in use.
- Ensure vehicles are locked, keys removed and high value items not left in view.
- Close and lock gates, doors, shutters and perimeter access points when not in use.
- Verify functionality of alarms, lighting, CCTV and access systems.
- Avoid stockpiling of goods and maintain good housekeeping to reduce opportunistic theft risk.
- Brief staff on expected risks, reporting channels and emergency procedures.
- Maintain visibility of security presence and patrols.
