EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Since the previous SITREP, protest activity has continued to expand geographically with additional marches, road blockades and demonstrations reported across multiple provinces. The majority of events remain non-violent, short-duration and under police monitoring.

Isolated incidents of higher-risk activity were recorded including tyre burning in Marlboro (Sandton), intimidation of foreign nationals in Alexandra and an isolated looting incident in Mahube Valley (Pretoria). No major clashes between protesters and security forces have been reported.

The primary risk for the remainder of the day is post-dispersal opportunistic criminality and targeted attacks against foreign nationals and foreign-owned businesses. Security forces remain deployed and operationally effective. Overall national threat level remains AMBER.



1. WHAT HAS HAPPENED (SINCE 09:00)



Tyre burning and road barricades reported on Zinnia Drive, Marlboro Drive, Sandton (GP), causing traffic disruption.



Road blockades reported in Isando (GP), KwaKhangela (Durban CBD) and Ilfracombe (KZN).



Looting incident reported in Mahube Valley, Pretoria (GP), in the vicinity of Stoffel Park.



Additional protest activity reported in Polokwane Ext 44 (LP) and Schweizer-Reneke (NW) with road blockades.



SAPS and NATJOINTS maintain heightened visibility at key hotspots and along major transport corridors.



No reports of major clashes between protesters and security forces.

3. INTELLIGENCE ASSESSMENT



Geographic spread of mobilisation has increased across six provinces but remains fragmented and localised.



Demonstrations are largely peaceful; anti-illegal immigration messaging is consistent across all reported events.



Isolated higher-risk incidents include intimidation, burning tyres, road blockades and opportunistic looting.



Primary risk remains attacks on foreign nationals and foreign-owned businesses post dispersal.



Law enforcement readiness remains high through visible deployments, intelligence coordination and integration with private security.



4. EXECUTIVE CLIENT ACTIONS



Maintain heightened situational awareness and monitor verified updates.



Review route plans for staff, logistics and deliveries.



Avoid identified hotspots where possible.



Maintain liaison with local SAPS, Metro Police and BPC operations.



Report incidents immediately through established escalation channels.



Reinforce security at foreign-owned commercial sites and vulnerable assets.

The highest risk period is expected between 15:00 and 21:00 as organised marches disperse and smaller groups may seek to engage in opportunistic criminality, intimidation or targeted attacks. No indicators at this stage suggest a shift towards coordinated nationwide disorder. Continuous monitoring is essential.
